What Music looks like at St Agnes?

The children enjoy singing, playing music, steel pans lessons, recorders, children have attended musical events and school performances.

How can we evidence attainment? We are currently looking at the best ways to assess music in an efficient and manageable way with reference to the progression in learning.

A person who has an enjoyment and understanding of different types of music and can perform confidently in front of an audience and show appreciation of others performances.

How we teach Music

We use the Manchester scheme called Charanga to support our curriculum. All lessons are made up of three sections Listen and Appraise, Musical Activities include Games, Singing, Playing, Improvising and Composing, Perform/ Share. Music is planned from the National Curriculum and linked to our Curriculum. Charanga is a fun and child friendly resource helping children to experience listening and moving to different pulses, listening and appreciating different styles of music., learning songs and performing them, using percussion instruments to accompany music and learning notation and playing a tuned instrument. Music is taught once a week in all classes from Nursery up to yr 6. We are currently reviewing our assessment process to make it more user friendly and effective. The curriculum is planned on a yearly overview to ensure all objectives are covered and then it is reviewed every term and at the end of the year. Currently staff are offered free training from Charanga on a yearly basis but we are also looking at how we can support the development of music teaching in school.
