Year 6 2024 SATs - usually in the first or second week of May each year, Year 6 pupils nationally have to sit some tests known as the SATs (Statutory Assessment Tests) in Grammar, Punctuation, Spelling; Reading and Maths (Arithmetic and Reasoning). Our pupils worked really hard and gave it their best and regardless of the outcomes, it is important to celebrate how hard they have worked through them as they were not easy!

Parent consultations - attendance at the consultations has improved slightly with most classes having over 80% taking time out to meet their child's teacher and receive an update on how they are doing. It is really important for parents and carers to maintain communication with teachers to ensure they know what is going on and also how to help children at home.

Our fifth **Chai.Coffee morning** was focussed on attendance and we had the council attendance officers in to share their work and raise awareness about the importance of attendance. Unfortunately we had very few parents turn up for this and we hope to hold one again soon on this very important issue.

Year 2



Star Group has been learning all about **money** this half term in our money skills lessons. We found out which coins were which, their **value** and how best to keep our money **safe**.




Attendance and punctuality

Attendance continues to be a big concern for our school community and we are sadly at the bottom of the table compared to our local schools in Manchester and in Longsight. This must change, as unfortunately the missed learning is huge for some of our children and as a result are performing not as well as they could do.

The table below shows the classes and their absence. We have **76 children who have missed more than 15 days of school** - that is 3 weeks of learning lost!

- 6.8% overall absence
 - 4.7% authorised
 - · 2.2% unauthorised
- 24.0% persistent absence
- · 26 pupils unauthorised absent for 10+ days

Absence Patterns

- · 14 pupils have been repeatedly late to school on the same day
- 6 pupils have recently worsened from previous good attendance
- 54 pupils have recently improved from previous poor attendance
