

Geography - Our Local Area

- Create your own map with sites that are very important to you. Put where you live in the middle of a piece of paper and label or draw sites around it that are important to you. It could be the park, school, Mosque, grandparents' house or where you play football etc. Don't forget to draw it like a map and include streets and roads.
- Look out your window. List all of the human features that you can see. Now, make a list of all the physical features you can see. Which features do you see more of?
- Can you map out your route to school? Think carefully about all the things you pass on your way.
- Take paper and drawing materials outside and draw a picture of your house or apartment building. Then pick your favourite place in your area. Walk to that favourite place and draw it on the paper and label it. Draw a line to make a route map on the paper showing how you got there. Then, choose another favourite place to walk to. Do this several times until you have a map showing all your favourite places in the local area.
