History -Children can place Ernest Shackleton's journey on a timeline and recall significant details of the expedition.

PSHCE -Children can describe the effect of global warming from the point of view of what damage is it doing to the Polar Regions.

Art - Children can create a landscape including the Northern Lights using mixed media.

English - Children can write a persuasive letter linked to climate change. Pupils can write an explanation text comparing the Arctic and Antarctic regions.

Geography -Children can locate the Arctic and Antarctic on a variety of maps becoming familiar with their climate zones and biomes. Children can talk about the Arctic and Antarctic in terms of its geographical position (longitude, latitude, hemisphere and where it is in relation to time zones). Children can say how the topographical features have changed over time (climate change and global warming).

DT- Children can design and make a useful object from common plastic waste.

Computing -Children will learn about how the internet works and how to stay safe when using online websites and Apps.

Science-Children can say how a living thing is adapted to its environment and how adaptation may lead to evolution with a focus on human evolution in the future. Children can say how characteristics are passed from parents to offspring. Children know the work of Charles Darwin and the origin of species.
