

Dinosaurs

What we already know:

In English, children will learn our T4W text 'The Little Green Dinosaur'. They will explore punctuation further and the use of the suffixes -ed, -er, and -est. Children will explore a range of fiction and non-fiction texts linked to the topic Dinosaurs.

In Geography, children will draw a map formed of a simple route, linked to our T4W text.

In Science, children will identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. They will focus on reptiles in connection to Dinosaurs. They will understand what is meant by carnivores, herbivores and omnivores and group Dinosaurs by what they eat.

In DT, children will understand that all food comes from plants or animals and that it is farmed, grown or caught elsewhere. Children will design and make a dish for a herbivore by using cutting and grating techniques.

In Music, children will create an untuned instrument in the form of a dinosaur. They will learn to play it with care and attention. They will investigate making different sounds that follow and rhythm and a beat.

In History, children will be able to find answers to simple questions and create a simple timeline of the prehistoric era. They will write sentences to describe the prehistoric era. Children will identify and recount the life of Mary Anning.

In Computing, children will use a search engine safely and with an adult to research a dinosaur.

In Art, children will explore the work of Louise Bourgeois and Jean Arp linked to sculpture. They will learn ways of manipulating a malleable media. They will use these techniques to experiment creating sculptures using salt dough.
