

Key Vocabulary	
Amphibians	Amphibians live in the water as babies and on land as they grow older. They have smooth, slimy skin.
Birds	All birds have a beak, two legs, feathers and wings.
Fish	Fish live and breathe under water. They have scaly skin, fins to help them swim and breathe through gills.
Mammals	Mammals are animals that breathe air, grow hair or fur and feed on their mother's milk as a baby.
Reptiles	All reptiles breathe air. They have scales on their skin
Carnivores	Animals that mostly eat other animals (meat) are carnivores.
Herbivores	Animals that eat only plants are herbivores.
Omnivores	Animals that eat both plants and other animals (meat) are omnivores.
sight	Your eyes let you see all the things around you
hearing	Your ears let you listen to all the things around you. Your brain tells you what different sounds are.
touch	Your skins gives you the sense of touch. You can tell if something is warm, cold, smooth or rough.
taste	Your sense of taste comes from your tongue. You might have some tastes that you like and ones that you don't.
smell	You smell using your nose. Your nose can tell if things smell nice or not.






Parts of the Body
