In Geography, children can create their own treasure maps using keys

They can follow maps using compass points and landmarks and use aerial photographs to recognise human and physical features.

In Computing, children can use pictograms to record data.

Spring 1 Year Two How do maps help us?

In Science, children will identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. They can find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. They will use their knowledge of materials to design and build a pirate ship.

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
