Seaside	a place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort.
Ocean	a continuous body of salt water that is contained in an enormous basin on Earth's surface.
Sea	general name for the body of salt water that covers the greater part of the surface of the Earth
Coast	The area where the sea and land meet.
Dunes	a mound of sand formed by the wind, usually along the beach
Tides	Tides are the daily or twice daily rise and fall of the oceans.
Man-made	made by people rather than nature.
Non-living	Things which cannot grow, move, breathe and reproduce
Ashore	on or to the shore
Mainland	The main part of a country or continent, not near the coast.
pollution	Pollution happens when the environment is contaminated, or dirtied, by waste, chemicals, and other harmful substances
